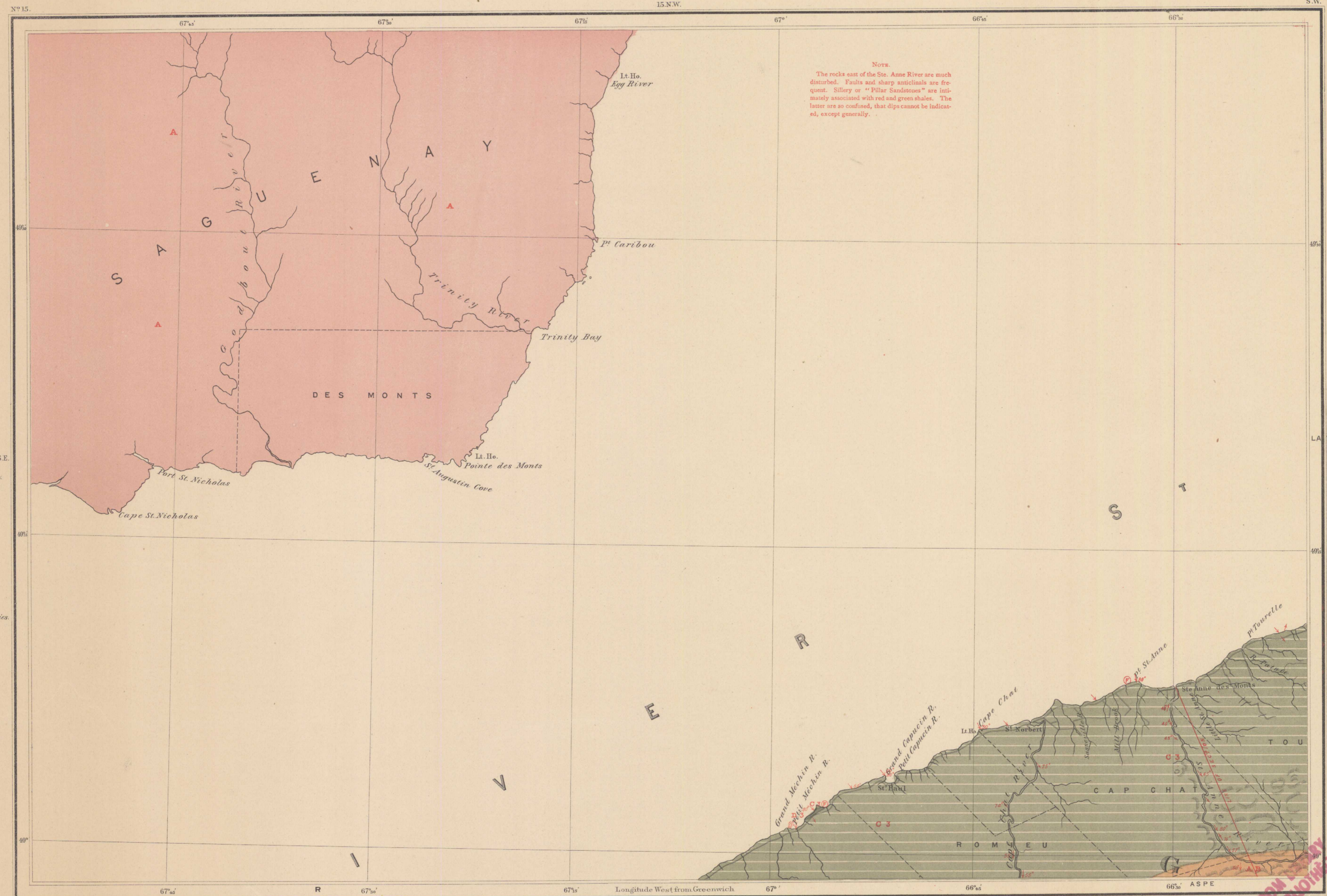

The rocks east of the Ste. Anne River are much disturbed. Faults and sharp anticlines are frequent. Silly or "Pillar Sandstones" are intimately associated with red and green shales. The latter are so confined, that dips cannot be indicated, except generally.
