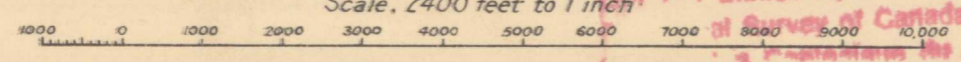
Peat more or less suitable for the manufacture of peat fuel	A	highly humified, good
