GEOGRAPHICAL AND TOPOGRAPHICAL DATA.

Instrumentally surveyed lines as follows—Line of Canadian Pacific Railway, as measured for Base by Dominion Lands Survey. Trial section line of C. P. Ry. Survey from Edmont via Maple Canyon and up Bonaparte Valley, also along north side of Kamloops Lake and up N. Thompson Valley. Lines by Dominion Lands Survey within the Estuary Belt, chiefly near Kamloops, Savona and Ashcroft. British Columbia Government Land Survey about Nicola and Stump Lakes. Some general surveys (1877) and numerous observations for latitude, by G. M. Dawson, F.R.S., and other employees. Apart from the above sources of information, the geographical outlines of the map are based on the topographical sketches, and sketches by J. McEvoy.
