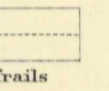

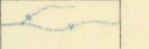

Magnetic declination about 27° East.

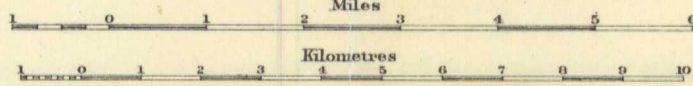

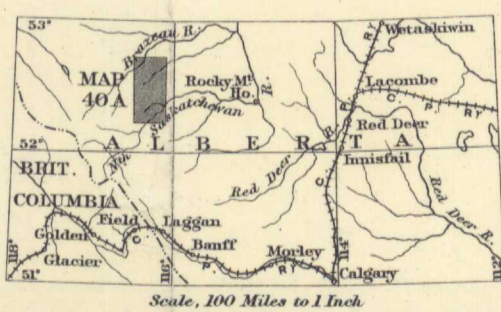
MAP 40 A
