

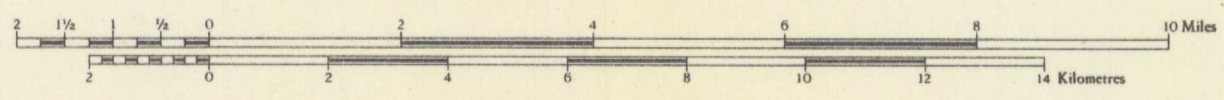

 (PRELIMINARY EDITION)

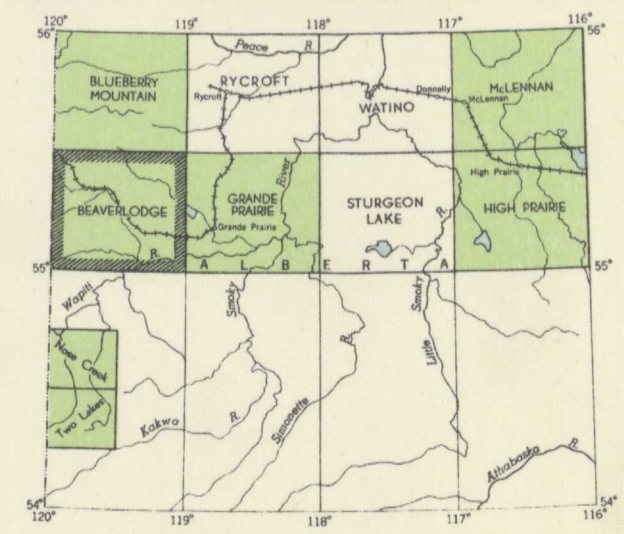

NOTE: In these areas the topography is of a very distinctive character, but too small to be shown on map. Sand ridges of the "Marchoise" (horseshoe-shaped) type, lightly wooded, are the predominating features. These are interspersed with small irregular swamps covering from 30 to 60 percent of the areas.
