

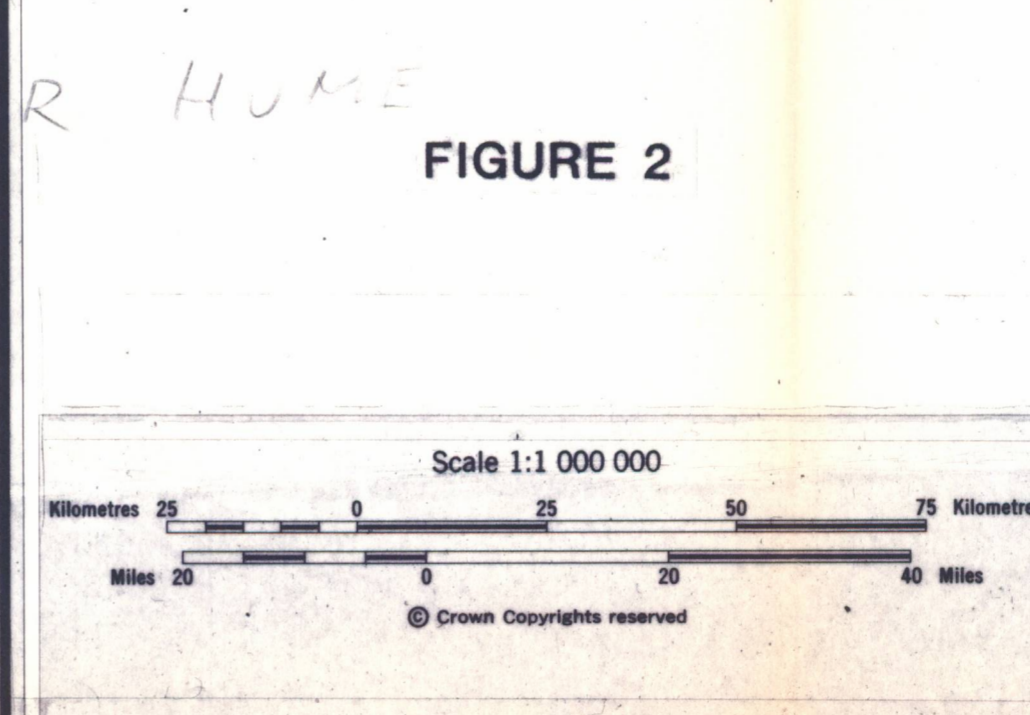

A	all limestone except for a discontinuous basal shaly unit
B	a lower limestone ±20m thick; remainder similar to but less argillaceous than belt C.
C	mostly argillaceous limestone with many thin shale breaks; commonly three or more 3 to 10 metres thick limestone beds that correlate over several tens of kilometres
E	total Hume consists of three or four shaly limestone/limestone couplets each 15 to 20 metres thick; no clear division between lower and upper Hume
