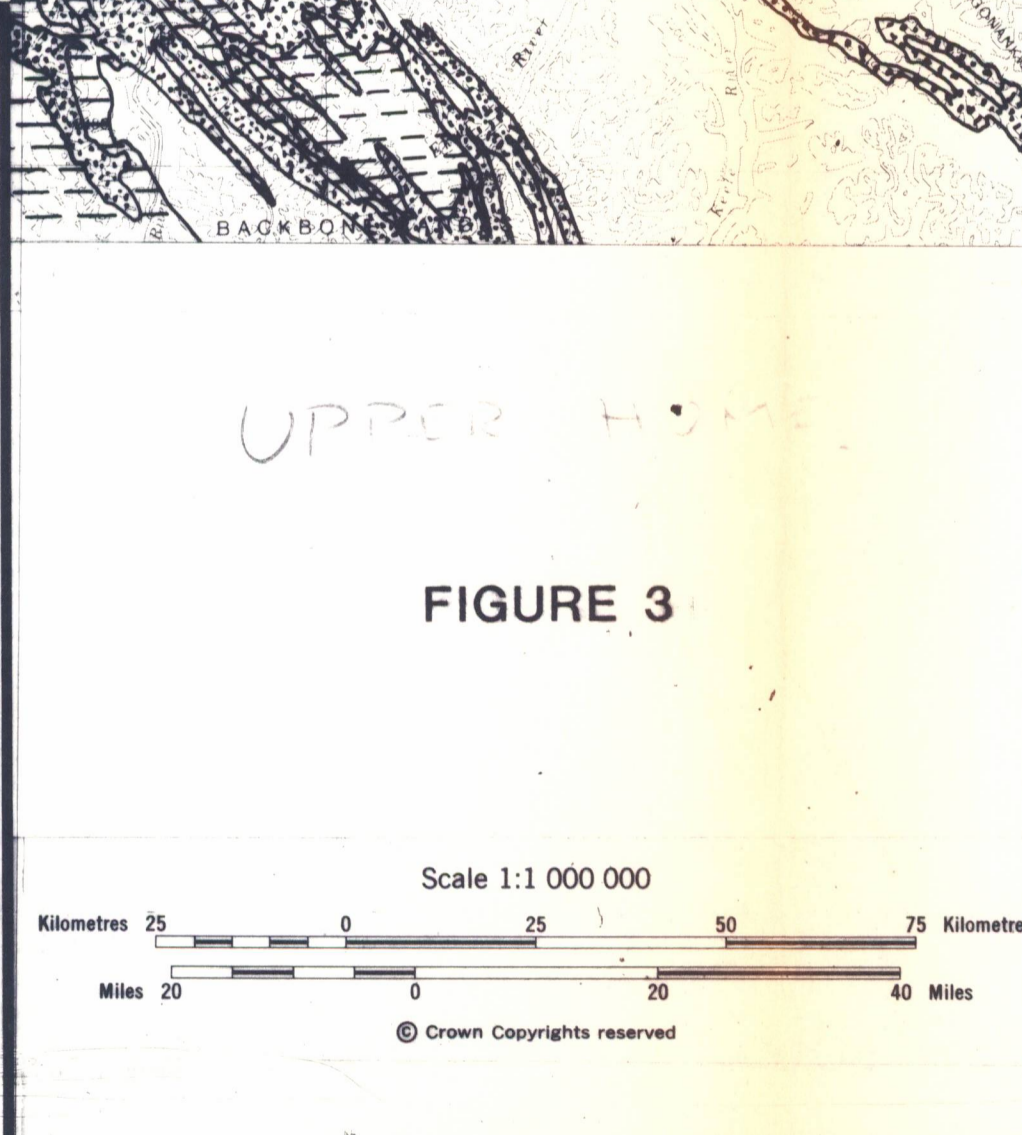


LEGEND

	Hume outcrops, too small to outline
	Western edge of Hume shallow-water carbonates

	Top and bottom markers, in feet
	30 thickness in metres

A	if present, upper Hume is inseparable from belt A lower Hume limestone
B	limestone with many metre-thick shale beds, some of which correlate over several tens of kilometres
C	lower part as belt B, upper part as belt D
D	limestone with very thin shale beds which cannot be correlated between wells, with the exception of a prominent bed, noted below
E	total Hume consists of three or four shaly limestone/limestone couplets, each 15 to 20 metres thick; no clear division between upper and lower Hume
