Abstract

Every available issue in private and public repositories of the Corner Brook, Newfoundland <u>Western Star</u> has been searched for historic seismic events and possibly related significant coastal flooding events from April 4, 1900 to June 15, 1964 when the seismograph was installed and began operating in St. John's, Newfoundland. The <u>Western Star</u> began as a weekly, became a semi-weekly in December, 1948, began to publish five weekdays a week in September, 1952 and then became a daily (except Sundays) in March of 1954. This study, of necessity, has produced the first systematic inventories of the locations of originals and microfilms, of microfilm gaps, of publishing frequency, of missing issues and the volume and issue numbering sequences for the <u>Western Star</u>. Only eight original issues are missing in the Bruce Stevenson Collection of about 2240 issues or 0.35% from April 4, 1900 to March 27, 1942. The overall interval searched had about 1% missing issues in the circa 5400 issues searched.

A total of 387 articles were extracted for the album of articles. About 83 storm, storm plus storm tide, or high tide events were identified as well as two seiche events on Lake Michigan; none of these 85 events are believed to represent a seismically-induced event except for a report of a previously-known tsunami from the known Good Friday Alaskan earthquake on March 27, 1964.

A total of 124 seismic events were extracted. Of this total, 27 of the events are Canadian or eastern U.S. earthquakes. Seven of the 27 seismic events were eastern U.S. events and one of these in New England may be a new, previously-unknown earthquake on September 7(?), 1926. A previouslyunknown foreshock of the 1250 GMT, December 3, 1929 Attica, New York earthquake may also have been defined, along with an eight-tremor, previously-unknown event "at New York" on December 3 (or 5), 1929.

Twelve of the 27 Canadian or eastern U.S. events are Canadian events, located outside Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. All these were previouslyknown. One of the articles on an event felt in the Hamilton-Toronto area greatly expands the felt area of the previously-known event at 0155 GMT on Tuesday, July 22, 1958. This event was known to have been felt in the St. Catherine's area but not in the Toronto area.

Two of the 27 Canadian or eastern U.S. events are Nova Scotian events. One of these identified only as a January, 1902 event is a new, previouslyunknown event that will require more research to pin down. The other was a previously-known aftershock of the November 18, 1929 Laurentian Slope or "Grand Banks" earthquake.

Six of the 27 Canadian or eastern U.S. events were Newfoundland events and included a previously-undocumented felt report of the Charlevoix earthquake on February 28, 1925 at Lomand on Bonne Bay in western Newfoundland. A new, previously-unknown, late April to early May, 1916 event in the northern Notre Dame Bay area will require further research. This earthquake was reported by mail to the <u>Western Star</u> and was felt circa April 24 to circa May 1, 1916 at the light station on Gull Island, 11.4 km east of Cape St. John in northern Notre Dame Bay near the town of La Scie, Newfoundland. Some additional felt localities are documented for the previously-known February 2, 1969 event in the Gander - Grand Falls - southern Notre Dame Bay area of Newfoundland.

Résumé

On a vérifié tous les numéros du <u>Western Star</u> publié à Corner Brook (Terre-Neuve) et qui sont disponibles dans les archives privées et publiques, dans le but d'y trouver mention d'événements sismiques et d'inondations côtières importantes possiblement associées, qui se seraient produits entre le 4 avril 1900 et le 15 juin 1964, date où on a installé et mis en service le sismographe de St. John's (Terre-Neuve). Le Western Star a d'abord été publié une fois par semain, puis deux fois en décembre 1948, puis cinq jours (sauf les fins de semaine) en septembre 1952, pour enfin devenir un journal quotidien (sauf les dimanches) en mars 1954. La présente étude a forcément permis de dresser le premier inventaire systématique de la localisations des originaux des tirages et des microfilms, des lacunes dans les microfilms, de la fréquence de publication, des numéros manquants et de la séquence de numérotation des numéros et volumes du Western Star. Il ne manque que huit numéros originaux à la collection Bruce Stevenson, qui compte environ 2 240 numéros, ou 0,35%, du 4 avril 1900 au 27 mars 1942. Il ne manquait qu'environ 1% des quelques 5 400 numéros examinés dans tout l'intervalle vérifié.

Au total, 387 articles ont été extraits pour compiler le recueil d'articles. Quatre-vengt-cinq événements ont été reconnus, dont 83 tempêtes, tempêtes plus raz-de-marée ou marées hautes et deux seiches sur le lac Michigan; aucun de ces 85 évéements n'avait une origine sismique à l'exception d'un raz-de-marée auparavant connu produit par le séisme qui a eu lieu en Alaska le vendredi saint, 27 mars 1964.

Au total, 124 événements sismiques ont été reconnus. Vingt-sept d'entre eux se sont produits au Canada ou dans l'est des États-Unis. L'un d'eux, en Nouvelle-Angleterre, pourrait être un séisme auparavant inconnu qui se serait produit probablement le 7 septembre 1926. Il se peut qu'on ait reconnu un précurseur auparavant inconnu du séisme survenu à 1250 GMT le 3 décembre 1929, à Attica, dans l'État de New York, de même qu'un événement auparavant inconnu comportant huit secousses, qui a eu lieu "at New York" le 3 (ou 5) décembre 1929.

Douze des 27 événements survenus au Canada ou dans l'est des États-Unis sont d'origine Canadienne et se sont produits à l'extérieur de la Novelle-Écosse et de Terre-Neuve. Tous ces événements étaient déjà connus. Un des articles portant sur un événement ressenti dans la région de Hamilton-Toronto élargit considérablement la zone où on a ressenti le séisme déjà connu, qui s'est produit le mardi 22 juillet 1958, à 0155 GMT. On savait déjà que cet événement avait été ressenti à proximité de St. Catharines, mais non pas dans la région de Toronto.

Deux de ces 27 événements se sont produits en Novelle-Écosse. L'un d'eux, qui remonte à janvier 1902, était auparavant inconnu et devra être étudié devantage afin de le localiser. L'autre est une réplique déjà connue du séisme qui s'est produit le 18 novembre 1929 sur le talus Laurentien ou le "Grand Banks" tremblement de terre.

Six de ces 27 séismes ont eu lieu à Terre-Neuve, y compris une secousse auparavant non documentée qui a été ressentie à Lomond, près de Bonne-Bay, dans l'ouest de Terre-Neuve; elle est associée au séisme de Charlevoix du 28 février 1925. Il faudra aussi étudier plus en détail un autre événement auparavant inconnu qui s'est produit en 1916 (fin avril-début mai), dans le nord de la région de la baie Norte-Dame. Signalé par courrier au <u>Western Star</u>, ce séisme a été ressenti entre <u>circa</u> le 24 avril et <u>circa</u> le l^{er} mai 1916 environ à la station de phare de l'île Gull, 11.4 km à l'est du Cap St-Jean, dans le nord de la baie Notre-Dame, près de la ville de La Scie, à Terre-Neuve. On a découvert d'autres endroits où on a ressenti le séisme connu de 2 février 1969, qui a eu lieu dans la région de Gander, Grand Falls et la partie sud de la baie Notre-Dame, à Terre-Neuve.

Introduction

Newfoundland and Labrador as the easternmost province of Canada lies on the Atlantic seaboard. The Island of Newfoundland protrudes well offshore to the east and represents Canada's most eastward extension. While seismicity is generally quite low in Newfoundland Canada's most tragic tsunamigenic earthquake occurred in the waters south of Newfoundland on November 18, 1929. This event of magnitude 7.2 spawned a tsunami that drowned 27 people in Newfoundland and one person in Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia. These deaths are the first recorded Canadian losses to a tsunami or to an earthquake within Canadian territory.

Newfoundland remained as a colony of Great Britain until 1949 when it joined the confederation of Canada and became the tenth province on April lst. Even though Memorial University of Newfoundland was formed shortly after confederation with Canada the Canadian government did not place a seismograph in Newfoundland for some 14 to 15 years.

The first seismograph was installed in Newfoundland in St. John's on the campus of Memorial University and apparently began operating in mid-1964; there are, however, reports of the seismograph's ongoing installation in local newspapers as early as July 4, 1963 with a September 1963 proposed completion (Appendix 4). It opened and began running consistently on June 1, 1964 at 47° 34.3'N, 52° 44.0'W, elevation 62 m (Station STJ). Three Willmore short-period instruments and three Columbia long-period instruments were installed (vertical; N-S and E-W horizontal) and these same instruments operated until March 31, 1989 when the station was closed apparently for budgetary considerations.

Introduction (continued)

A seismic station was opened about October 16, 1976 in Corner Brook (Station CBK) at 48° 55.182'N, 57° 58.182'W, elevation 380 m. This station has only a short-period vertical instrument and has operated somewhat sporadically recently.

Thus, Newfoundland had no instrumental data prior to June 1, 1964 and the best record of felt earthquakes in Newfoundland before June, 1964 will be found in the written record from sources such as community newspapers or possibly diaries, letters or even certain folklore sources. Newfoundland has never been densely populated and even today most communities are along the coast to facilitate the prosecution of the fishery. Furthermore Newfoundland has never had a large number of newspapers in its outport communities and by far and away the concentration of newspaper publishing was tound in the colonial capital St. John's. Generally no other community on the island of Newfoundland has ever developed to the point that a daily newspaper could survive.

The exception to this was Corner Brook (previously known as Curling and prior to June 8, 1915 known as Birchy Cove) where the <u>Western Star</u> began on April 4, 1900. The <u>Western Star</u> began publishing with Vol. I, No. 1 on Wednesday, April 4, 1900 two days each week on Wednesday and Saturdays, then quickly switched to Tuesdays and Fridays on May 1, 1900. With the first issues of 1902, it became a weekly on Wednesdays, reverted to a Tuesday and Friday schedule on May 28, 1901 then back to a weekly on Wednesdays on January 1, 1902. This frequency was held until Friday, February 20, 1931 when a daily sequence and various other sequences were tried through to May 8, 1931 when the weekly schedule on Wednesdays was reverted to. It changed to a weekly on Fridays in the 1942-1946 period.

Introduction (continued)

On Tuesday, December 7, 1948 the Western Star began to publish semiweekly on Tuesdays and Fridays. On Monday, September 15, 1952 the newspaper reset its volume and issue numbers to No. 1 and began to publish daily, except on Saturdays and Sundays (Vol. 1, No. 1). The issue number sequence became quite fouled up on December 4, 1953 when the sequence went, 308, 309, 3010, 3011, etc. and again on April 19, 1954 when it went from 3109 to 31010 and again on December 14, 1954 when the issue number went from 31209 to 312010. Three issues later, someone finally noticed and the volume number and issue number were reset to their proper spot and the sequences remained reasonable through to the end of our search on June 15, 1964. During the aberrant issue sequence, the Western Star became a daily (except Sundays) on Saturday, March 6, 1954 (Volume 2, No. 3074) (not January 2, 1954 as Ellison, 1988 indicates in Appendix 1). This daily publishing sequence persists to the present day. The Western Star remains as the only Newfoundland daily outside of the Evening Telegram in St. John's and is still one of the few independently-owned newspapers in Newfoundland.

Corner Brook is a regional centre at the head of the Bay of Islands and at the mouth of the Humber River. The newspaper generally served as a newspaper of record for the west coast of the Island of Newfoundland and was a source of news for much of the west coast and even parts of the isolated south coast and interior parts of the province. As such the <u>Western Star</u> is an excellent regional newspaper to search for events of importance to the historical seismicity of central and western Newfoundland.

Previous historic seismicity contracts by the Geological Survey of Canada have concentrated on sources in St. John's (Staveley et al., 1984;

1986; 1988, in prep.; 1989, in prep.). This study is designed to take advantage of a source of original copies of the <u>Western Star</u> recently found in western Newfoundland and to provide a near-continuous sampling of the felt seismicity above magnitude 3 to 4 for much of western Newfoundland from April 1900 to the time of installation and commissioning of Newfoundland's first seismograph on about June 1, 1964.

This contract was subject to some press comment in the Ottawa <u>Citizen</u> of Friday, February 9, 1990 when an article by Dominique Lacasse noted "a \$4,000 - deal with another Halifax Company to review newspaper stories on earthquakes for Energy, Mines and Resources" (Appendix 2). The rather illinformed article, apparently written only from the title of the Department of Supply and Services contract, caused some consternation within the Department of EMR at the officials' level. A Letter to the Editor was sent to set the record straight (Appendix 2) and eventually a highly-edited version was published in the Citizen on Thursday, March 1, 1990 (Appendix 2).

Locations and Holdings of the Western Star

If a mistake was made in this project, it was to not caretully inventory, in person, the holdings of microfilm of, and original copies of, the <u>Western Star</u> long <u>before</u> the project began and indeed before it was bid. Indexes in the local St. John's institutions and catalogues (Ellison, 1988; Appendix 1) are inadequate and often incomplete or in error and often persons in the institutions are unclear as to their holdings. Even as the project began in earnest, the need for a complete inventory was not impressed strongly enough upon the St. John's personnel involved and the requirement was let slide until the project was done (Table 1). In the case of

the Public Archives of Newfoundland and Labrador (PANL) holdings, it was not realized until after the St. John's researchers were finished that PANL did indeed have some bound volumes and their own staff kindly provided the inventory in Table 3. The lack of a careful inventory lead to some confusion and a failure to copy a few articles from the original copies in Corner Brook when we had a person there on another matter.

The Provincial Reference and Resource Library (PRRL) in St. John's has been designated as the repository for original copies of Newfoundland newspapers. Much of the PANL collection of the <u>Western Star</u> originals has been transferred to PRRL (Table 2). However, PRRL's facilities for storage have quickly become quite overcrowded and some of the collection of the <u>Western Star</u> still remains at PANL (Table 3) though Calvin Best's letter of May 3, 1990 indicates that the rest of the collection of bound originals will go to PRRL shortly (Table 3). PRRL also has a small collection of wrapped bundles of individual papers, per Mr. Derek Bussey's letter of January 8, 1989[sic] - 1990 (Table 2).

However, neither PANL's or PRRL's collection of bound or unbound originals appear to go back before January, 1946. Through good fortune and a response to a Letter to the Editor placed in the <u>Western Star</u> in 1985 seeking information on a 1925 seismic event, we came to realize that a Mr. Bruce Stevenson of Corner Brook held a large and significant collection of the <u>Western Star</u> originals from the very first issue on April 4, 1900 (Vol. I, No. 1) through to March 27, 1942 (Volume 42, No. 52).

The Stevenson Collection is remarkable for its good condition and its completeness. Over the 42-year collection, only eight issues are known to be missing and only five issues are known to have a page missing or pages

that are shredded and unuseable; only eight missing issues in about 2240 or 0.35%! Mr. Stevenson produced a complete inventory of his collection when we first established contact in 1985 and this is reproduced in full detail in Table 4. This inventory represents a great deal of time on Mr. Stevenson's part and his effort deserves to be recognised.

Much of the <u>Western Star</u> has been microfilmed and the inventory of available microfilm is found in Table 1 for PRRL, PANL, the Centre for Newfoundland Studies (CNS) at Memorial University of Newfoundland (MUN) and for the Corner Brook Public Library and National Library of Canada. Contact was made with the offices of the <u>Western Star</u> directly at (709) 634-4348 at Canadian Newspapers Co. Ltd. in Corner Brook and it was established that the <u>Western Star</u> has exactly the same microfilm gaps as all the other collections have; they hold no originals any longer. Similarly, the Corner Brook Public Library and the National Library in Ottawa microfilm collections reflect the same contents and the same gaps as the Newfoundland collections at PRRL and PANL.

The Centre for Newfoundland Studies holds only a microfilm collection from November 3, 1952 onwards (Table 1) and holds no originals. The Newspaper Archives of the British Library at Colindale Avenue in London, England hold no copies of the <u>Western Star</u> in either microfilm or as originals.

Thus, the microfilm inventories in Table 1 and the inventories of originals in Tables 2 and 3 represent the best, most detailed and most complete inventories of the publically-held collections of the <u>Western</u> <u>Star</u>. The inventory in Table 4 is the first made of the Stevenson Collection and represents the most complete record of the first 41 years'

of publishing history of the <u>Western Star</u>, giving volume and issue numbers, missing or repeated issue numbers, muddled dates as well as publishing frequency. No such record in such detail is available for the period after March 27, 1942 except fot the period searched by Ms. Katherine Hattie from May 16, 1947 to September 5, 1956 inclusive (Table 5).

Her search notes record the details of missing issues, missing pages, misnumbered issues, etc., etc. In this period of 9.30 years or about 1581 issues, there are only 24 missing issues and a further 21 issues with damaged or missing pages. Thus, only 1.52% of the interval is missing. The other two post-1942 intervals searched were found to have a similar completeness.

None of the inventories in this compilation generally go much past the June 15, 1964 date which was the cut-off of this search (15 days after the apparent June 1, 1964 commissioning of the St. John's seismograph). Note that a late chance discovery of a July 4, 1963 article in <u>The Evening</u> <u>Telegram</u> implies that the seismograph was, in fact, installed earlier than June 1, 1964 (Appendix 4). However, the collection of seismograms from the St. John's station only begins with the June 1, 1964 record. (John Adams, personal communication, winter, 1990).

Missing Issues

As noted above, only eight original issues are missing between the <u>Western Star's</u> inception on April 4, 1900 and March 27, 1942 in the Stevenson Collection. Original copies of the <u>Western Star</u> seem to be missing for Wednesday, April 3, 1942 through to the issue prior to Friday, January 4, 1946 (Volumes 43, 44, 45 and most of 46) as seen in Table 2.

Missing Issues (continued)

The 1942 to 1946 gap above may, in fact, not be missing since microfilms exist, however we did not locate these originals in St. John's.

Within the microfilm collection, there are more gaps and different gaps than those found in the originals. In the early years, there were at least two separate microfilming efforts and some years are only available from the PANL microfilm collection on negative microfilm (Table 1). This 1 9 further complicated by the fact that PANL will not loan these microfilms not even to let them be copied locally at the Memorial University Library Copy Service and the copying machine at PANL is totally inadequate for the job in that it makes only highly reduced copies on a distasteful chemicalbased paper. In most cases, we resorted to taking these reduced "chemical copies" where we had to use them and enlarging them on a standard xerox machine to make a large enough and dark enough copy that one can read and use in the Appendix 5 album of articles.

The two series of microfilming efforts shows up as well as overlaps in the PANL and PRRL microfilm collections of the <u>Western Star</u> (Table 1). The PANL microfilm collection stops on March 31, 1960 (Table 1). The PRRL microfilm collection is the more significant collection and we present a complete inventory in Table 1 (part 2). The CNS microfilm collection only begins on November 3, 1952 and runs to the present and exactly reflects the PRRL collection as does that held at the Corner Brook Public Library and at the <u>Western Star</u> itself. The Newspaper Archives of the British Library at Colindale Avenue in London, England hold no copies or microfilms of the Western Star.

Missing Issues (continued)

Despite the two basic overlapping microfilm collections, six microfilm gaps persist in both collections as seen below:

None of these six microfilm gaps can be filled on microfilm at any institution. Two additional gaps in the microfilm at PRRL in 1924 and 1930 (Table 1) can be filled by using the negative microfilm at PANL (Table 1).

The first five of these microfilm gaps (above) are available in the Stevenson Collection in Corner Brook with copies being made on a local copier directly from the bound originals. For most of the project, we were resigned to not being able to search the sixth gap from Thursday, September 6, 1956 to Wednesday, September 4, 1957 inclusive. We had been told that this volume of originals was not available at PRRL or PANL. In preparing the final report, a handwritten index of PRRL holdings obtained on an August, 1989 visit was rediscovered at the bottom of the project file. It indicated that PRRL held original copies of the Western Star for September-December, 1956, January-April, 1957 and May-August, 1957. Daniel Boyce reapproached PRRL with a copy of the two index sheets and the missing three volumes were located down in the vault under PRRL. These volumes could not, however, be copied directly in accordance with PRRL policy. Thus, the twelve articles involved could not be reproduced without a month-long delay for a special microfilm to be made and these twelve are only included as a transcript of the headline in the album of articles (Appendix 5).

Missing Issues (continued)

Thus, in the end, for the whole search period from April 4, 1900 to June 16, 1964 we are only missing the eight issues missing in the Bruce Stevenson Collection (Table 4), the 24 issues missing in the period searched by Katharine Hattie (Table 5) and an unknown but similar number missing in the two periods searched by Daniel Boyce; this represents about 1% missing issues in circa 5400 issues searched.

It would be valuable for future researchers if the six major microfilm gaps above could be filled while the original copies of the <u>Western Star</u> for these periods still exist intact and can still be physically handled. We would also recommend that the twelve negative microfilms in the PRRL collection be replaced with positive microfilms again while the originals survive and that the P.A.N.L. collection of <u>Western Star</u> microfilms be duplicated where necessary to allow for interlibrary loans; P.A.N.L. will not loan any of its microfilms as a matter of policy.

Methodology

In the Fall of 1989, Alan Ruffman had occasion to be in St. John's and did a preliminary indexing of the <u>Western Star</u> at PRRL for purposes of preparing a proposal for the Department of Supply and Services and the Geological Survey of Canada. Geomarine Associates Ltd. had an ongoing contract during the Fall of 1989 documenting tsunamis in Newfoundland sources and Andrew Smith and Gavin Buchan worked on this project. During the Fall of 1989, Andrew Smith was in Corner Brook to search certain periods of the Corner Brook <u>Western Star</u> in the Bruce Stevenson Collection. At this time, Mr. Stevenson provided us with a full copy of the results of

his search from April 4, 1990 up to the end of 1925. He had searched for items of local and genealogical interest and had noted all seismic, high tidal, major storm, and flooding events in addition.

During his visit to Corner Brook, Andrew Smith copied all articles defined in the 1900-1925 period which we knew to be in one of the known microfilm gaps in the PRRL or PANL microfilm collections in St. John's. This is where the failure to do a careful pre-project inventory caused problems in that, in late February, 1990, another, and a larger, microfilm gap was found in the St. John's microfilm collection. Dionne Snow, a student in Corner Brook, had to be called in to search the March 23, 1938 to April 4, 1938; the March 1, 1939 to April 3, 1940 and the April 2, 1941 to March 24, 1942 periods and to copy some missing articles available only on the originals.

It was assumed that the two students who had been hired to do the CHS tsunami project in the Fall of 1989 would carry on in the winter of 1990 to do the <u>Western Star</u> search. That assumption did not get realized as they encountered heavy course loads and burn out. By February 5, 1990 it was realized that no progress whatsoever had been made on the <u>Western Star</u> search and Daniel Boyce was contracted in St. John's with residual supervision by Gavin Buchan to get him started.

It became clear very quickly as the project finally began that one researcher in St. John's would not be enough, given the time constraints. A second researcher, Katherine Hattie, was added in Halitax and microfilms were borrowed from PRRL and the National Library through the Public Archives of Nova Scotia. PRRL had a policy of only loaning out six

microfilms at a time. Even by returning these promptly in pairs and requesting more could not give us the turn around we needed. Ms. Hattie was on occasion left with no Western Star microfilms in Halitax (Table 5).

It took a near constant series of phone calls to PRRL to give them the taith to eventually get up to 12 microfilms in transit going and coming. Eventually, we broke taith and ordered several years from the National Library in Ottawa; they had no such restrictions on the numbers of microtilms that could be borrowed (PANL will let <u>none</u> of their microfilms out, which totally frustrates out-of-town research).

Daniel Boyce in St. John's borrowed the microflims from PRRL and transported them to CNS and the MUN Library Copy Service where copies were made by xerox onto plain paper. Katherine Hattie used the PRRL microfilms at the Public Archives of Nova Scotia (PANL) and could make xerox copies onto plain paper herself on PANL's machine. She was the only person in the project able to exercise a direct hands-on-control of copy quality onto plain paper.

In St. John's, where Daniel Boyce had to make copies from the PANL negative microfilm he was forced to accept highly reduced, positive, "chemical copies"; no enlarging lenses seemed to be available. He then went to a MUN enlarging xerox copier and made enlarged darkened copies of the small rather pale "chemical copies" and generally we were able to get satisfactory copies to mount in the album found in Appendix 5.

Daniel Boyce checked his proposed copy lists initially with Gavin Buchan then directly with Alan Ruttman; the late night, somewhat cheaper rate telephone call or tacsimile message became essential to the project.

Danny Boyce regularly sent his annotated articles across to Halitax and Kathy Hattie made up the master album pages, clipped the articles and mounted them initially in her dry periods between available PRRL microtilms, then in the evenings and on the weekends as the work load mounted and the March 31, 1990 deadline approached.

All the searching of microfilms was just completed on March 31, 1990, but several inventories, various copying chores and quite a bit of clipping and mounting slid well across the March 31, 1990 deadline. The report was quite late. Final gaps that were realized in compilation or confusions in page and volume numbers had to be sorted out with the help of P.R.R.L. staff and this dragged on into June. Derek Bussey and Charles Cameron were essential in this regard at P.R.R.L. Derek Bussey also located, late in our search, a "partial index" to the <u>Western Star</u> (but mainly to the St. John's newspapers) which Ellison (1988) mentions; it provided two additonal article references.

Articles Located

The album of 387 mounted articles in Appendix 5 represents the results of the search. These 387 articles are supplemented by three additional articles on the Sunday, February 2, 1969 southern Notre Dame Bay, Newtoundland earthquake forwarded by the Editor of <u>The Pilot</u> of Lewisporte, Newtoundland. Michael J. Ralph, the Editor, was aware of our tsunami and <u>Western</u> <u>Star</u> search and forwarded these articles reporting new felt locations for the 1969 event. The three articles are included here in Appendix 3 for want of a better place and to ensure that these data are not lost to the G.S.C. A single, early article on the installation of the Memorial

University seismograph was located in <u>The Evening Telegram</u> of Thursday, July 4, 1963 via the "partial index" cited by Ellison, (1988); (Appendix 1). This article tound late in the project is found in Appendix 4.

Only articles on seismic events, tsunamis, seiches, high tidal, flooding or significant storm events were extracted in this project. The Appendix 5 album of articles is preceded by a chronological list of all 387 articles found, citing the headline and in many cases a few words quoted directly from the article to illustrate the type of event documented and the area. The dates or information in the chronological list of Appendix 5 in [square] brackets are not quoted from the articles' headlines or texts and are added to date, amplify or identify the event. eg:

Wed., Apr., 17, 1940 Earth Tremors Felt on South Coast ... at Rencontre West and Francois ... [Thurs., April 11, 1940, not in Smith, 1966 but tound in Staveley, et al., 1984]

The events recorded have been partitioned into two tables. Table 6 is a chronological listing of all storm events, related storm or lunar high tide events, and seiches located in the search period. Table 7 is a chronological listing of all earthquake events located in the search period.

About 83 storm, storm plus storm tide, or high lunar tide events were tound (Table 6). An additional two seiche events on Lake Michigan were located tor a total of 85 events. On Saturday, June 26, 1954 a tragic and apparently squall-induced seiche swept in on Chicago's beaches, drowning as many as 13 persons. The article reports a similar event near Holland, Michigan in 1938 which drowned 5 persons and notes that the 1954 event is the seventh freak tidal wave or seiche in the Great Lakes in this century. None of the 85 events in Table 6 is believed to represent a

seismically-induced event except the report of the previously-known Alberni-Port Alberni tsunami of March 27-28, 1964 which was caused by the Good Friday Alaskan Earthquake of Friday, March 27, 1964.

Seismic Events Located

The Table 7 listing of earthquake events found in the search includes 124 events. Few are Canadian events and there is a perponderence of the events in the 1952 to 1964 period (72%). This apparent skewing of the articles found is not believed to reflect more diligent searching in the 1952-1964 period, but rather reflects a change in the <u>Western Star</u>'s news selection, a change in the news service used, a change in the focus of the news service itself or possibly a change in worldwide seismicity with more serious and hence more "newsworthy" earthquakes occurring. No attempt has been made to analyse the 97 seismic events noted which occurred outside of Canada and outside of the eastern United States.

Of the 124 seismic events, 27 are Canadian or eastern U.S. events. Of these, seven were eastern U.S. events (Table 7) and four of these were listed in Smith (1962, 1966) and were, therefore, previously-known. The event reported in the <u>Western Star</u> of Wed., Sept. 8, 1926, p. 6, col. 5, as being in New England on Tuesday(?), Sept. 7(?), 1926 (Table 7) is not reported in Smith (1962) and is a new event, unless it is somehow a misdated report of the Saturday, August 28, 1926 event in New England which is found in Smith (1962). The Attica, New York event on Tuesday, December 3, 1929 at 12:50 (GMT or 0750 EST) is reported in the <u>Western Star</u> on December 11, 1929, p. 1, cols. 4 & 5, as being felt (or at least recorded?) in Ottawa on "Tuesday morning [Dec. 3, 1929] at 1.30" (EST local time) and this may be a new report of an earlier, previously-unknown foreshock of

this event. The <u>Western Star</u> of Wednesday, December 11, 1929, p. 1, cols. 4 & 5, reports that, "Eight earthquake tremors were felt at New York" on Tuesday night, December 3, 1929 (or possibly on Thursday night, December 5, 1929); in either case, the events appear not to be reported in Smith (1966) and are previously-unknown events. Further work on New York, Ontario and New England sources will be needed to check these three events.

Of the 27 Canadian and eastern U.S. events reported in the <u>Western</u> <u>Star</u>, twelve were Canadian events outside Nova Scotia and Newtoundland (Table 7); nine of these are in Smith (1962, 1966) and were, therefore, previously-known. We have assumed that the Wednesday, September 2, 1953 Terrace, B.C. event, the circa 0932 EDT, Wednesday, September 4, 1963 Battin Bay earthquake and the 0305 EST, Wednesday, January 8, 1964 Rolphton/Deep River events are all in the Canadian Earthquake Epicentre File (CEEF); they are all beyond the scope of Smith (1966).

The event recorded in the <u>Western Star</u> of July 22, 1958, p. 1, col. 1 (Table 7), as having occurred on Monday, July 21, 1958 at 10:55 p.m. ADT (0155 GMT or UT, Tuesday, July 22, 1958) in St. Catherines, Hamilton, Toronto, Markham and Willowdale is recorded in Smith (1966) in the Canadian section as a Tuesday, July 22, 1958 event at 0146:40 GMT (1046:40 ADT) "about 15 miles west of Welland, Ont. Felt at St. Catherines and vicinity". The telt locations of Toronto, Markham and Willowdale appear to be new telt localities that greatly expand the telt area of this event.

Of the 27 seismic events in Canada and the eastern U.S. reported in the <u>Western Star</u>, two were Nova Scotian events (Table 7). The <u>Western Star</u> of Wednesday, August 6, 1902, p. 3, col. 5 contained a list of "Earthquakes In 1902" and cites a January, 1902 Nova Scotian earthquake, but does not give

an exact date or a telt location. No January, 1902 Nova Scotian earthquake is cited in Smith (1962) or in Ruttman and Peterson (1986). The January, 1902 event in Nova Scotia is, therefore, a new, previously-unknown event but will require further work in Nova Scotian sources to pin it down.

A Thursday, December 12, 1929 (attershock) earthquake is cited (<u>Western</u> <u>Star</u> of Dec. 18, 1929, p. 1, cols 1 & 2) as being recorded in Ottawa and in Nova Scotia without an exact time and may possibly be a new event; it is not noted in Smith (1962) on the 12th. However, we believe this is simply a report of the Friday, December 13, 1929, previously-known attershock that was felt in Nova Scotia at 0058:01 GMT or at 2058:01 AST on Thursday, December 12, 1929 (local time); it is not a new event.

Of the 27 Canadian and eastern U.S. seismic events noted in the Western Star six were Newtoundland events (Table 7):

- Approximately Monday, April 24 to circa Monday, May 1, 1916 Cape St. John, northern Notre Dame Bay
- 2. Saturday, February 28, 1925 telt at Lomand on Bonne Bay
- 3.1 A possible foreshock (?) of the main Monday, November 18, 1929 event felt 7 minutes before the main event at Corner Brook
- 3.2 The main event on Monday, November 18, 1929 telt island-wide

4. Thursday, April 11, 1940 at Recontre West and Francois, south coast

5. Thursday, January 5, 1956 - Conception Bay, Trinity Bay

Of the six events, only the well-known, Monday, November 18, 1929 event is noted in Smith (1966). Smith does not note the possible foreshock event cited in the <u>Western Star</u> of Wednesday, November 20, 1929 (p. 2, col. 2) as occurring seven minutes before the main shock in Curling (Corner Brook); this may possibly be a new event or a foreshock of the main event. It may also be a mixing of reports where the local times noted by observers

differed by seven minutes.

The event felt at Lomond on Bonne Bay at 10:55 p.m., NST, Saturday February 28, 1925 and reported in the <u>Western Star</u> on Wed., March 18, 1925 on p. 2, col. 3 is the first documented, felt report of the Saturday, February 28, 1925, 2119:20 EST (2049:20 NST), Charlevoix, P.Q. earthquake. Smith (1962) and his map on page [303] do not cite this major event as having been felt in Newtoundland. Staveley <u>et al</u>. (1984) had found a poorly-documented recollection of this Newtoundland felt report by a Dr. L.M. Green in the newspapers after the November 18, 1929 Laurentian Slope earthquake, but had not traced its origin or been able to confirm it (Staveley <u>et al.</u>, 1984, p.16, and p. 27; Adams <u>in</u> Staveley, <u>et al</u>., 1984, p.2). This felt report of the February 28, 1925 Charlevoix earthquake is a new event for Newtoundland and will require the isoseismal lines on Smith's (1962) rigure on page [303] to be slightly redrawn to extend further along strike of the Appalachian mountain chain.

The event telt on Thursday, April 11, 1940 along the south coast of Newtoundland at Rencontre West and Francois and the event telt in Conception Bay on Thursday, January 5, 1956 at 11:20 a.m. are both events that are not in Smith (1966). However, both these events were caught by Staveley et al. (1984) in their first compilation.

The Newtoundland event noted in the <u>Western Star</u> of Wednesday, May 10, 1916, p. 2, col. 3 (Table 7; Appendix 5) is noted as having been reported "by mail this week" and as having occurred at "The light station Cape John, Gull Island". Two shocks were telt over a one minute interval and "dishes, pictures and other articles were thrown to the floor and smashed ... ". The likely date is circa Monday, April 24 to circa Monday, May 1, 1916.

Regardless of the event's exact date, it is not in Smith (1962) or in Staveley <u>et al</u>. (1984 or 1986). It is not on the Canadian Earthquake Epicentre File (personal communication, Anne Stevens and John Adams, Geological Survey of Canada, Ottawa, December 21, 1989). It is a new Newfoundland event that will require additional work in Newfoundland sources to pin down its exact date and other felt locations. There was an April 24, 1916 event recorded at 1107:45 a.m. (local time) at Ottawa that was "centred in an uninhabited region of Quebec some 125 miles north of Hull" (Smith, 1962).

There is a "Gull Island" 11.4 km directly to the east of Cape St. John in northern Notre Dame Bay. The lighthouse on Gull Island (49° 59' 54"N, 55° 21' 33"W) was established in 1884 and was in place and occupied in 1916; it still operates (Light No. 326, CHS Chart 4520; personal communication, Gordon Stead, Canadian Hydrographic Service, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, October 5 and 9, 1990). The 1916 event felt in northern Notre Dame Bay may be related to the newly-recognised February 2, 1969 event (Appendix 3) felt in southern Notre Dame Bay (Staveley <u>et al.</u>, 1984).

The search of the <u>Western Star</u> also turned up three personal accounts and one bylined story of the November 18, 1929 tsunami event on the south coast of Newfoundland. The personal accounts by Alice Bayley (1953), Don Morris (1958) and James H. Hussey (1959) and the 50th anniversary story by Michael MacKenzie (1979) appear to have been published in various other Newfoundland journals at about the same time they were printed in the <u>Western Star</u>. The November 18, 1929 tsunami was not subject to recollections and historic commemoration for the first 20-25 years after the event. It has only been in recent years that the annual 5th year or 10th year

anniversaries have been marked by first-hand recollections and more recently by secondary accounts as survivors die over time.

Conclusions

This study has identified a large number of storms and storm tide events in Newfoundland that will be of interest to coastal geologists. None, including the Lake Michigan apparent seiches, are believed to be seismically-related tsunami events. However, seven apparently new seismic events in Canada and the eastern U.S. have been identified and one event has had its felt area expanded.

- January, 1902 Nova Scotian event. More research is needed in Nova Scotian sources.
- Circa Monday, April 24 to Monday, May 1, 1916 at Gull Island, 11.4 km directly east of Cape St. John, northern Notre Dame Bay, Newtoundland. More research is needed in Newtoundland sources.
- 3. Saturday, February 28, 1925 at 10:55 p.m., NST, telt report of the Charlevoix earthquake telt at Lomond, Bonne Bay, Newtoundland.
- 4. Tuesday(?), Sept. 7(?), 1926 in New England (unless somehow a confusion with the reported (Smith, 1962) event on Saturday, August 28, 1926). More research is needed in New England sources.
- 5. Tuesday morning, December 3, 1929 at 1:30 EST (a.m. local time) in Ottawa. This may be a new event or a previously-unknown foreshock of the 1250 GMT (0750 EST) December 3, 1929 Attica, New York event (or a confusion of times?). More research is needed in Ontario and New York sources.
- Tuesday night, December 3, 1929 (or possibly Thursday night, December 5, 1929), "Eight earthquake tremors were telt at New York". Further research is needed in New York sources.
- Monday, November 18, 1929 possible toreshock seven minutes before the main shock at Curling (Corner Brook), Newtoundland.
- Monday, July 21, 1958 at 10:55 p.m. ADT (2155 EDT) in St. Catherines, Hamilton, Toronto, Markham and Willlowdale is an expanded report of the documented (Smith, 1966) Tuesday, July 22, 1958 event at 0146:40 GMT (Monday, July 21, 1958 at 2146:40 EDT).

Conclusions (continued)

Of the eight events above, three appear to be definitely new events; one in the northern part of Notre Dame Bay of Newfoundland in late April to early May, 1916, one in Nova Scotia in January, 1902, and an eight-tremor event "at New York" on Tuesday (or Thursday) night, December 3 (or 5), 1929. Each of these events will need some additional research that is beyond the scope of this study.

Acknowledgements

The senior author would like to acknowledge the input of his six coauthors. Corner Brook Public Library holds microtilms from 1907 onwards with the same gaps as are found at the Public Archives of Newtoundland and Labrador. Similarly, the <u>Western Star</u> (Canadian Newspapers Co. Ltd.) itself only holds microfilm with the same gaps. The <u>Western Star</u> office has no albums of binding copies. No one apparently holds the microfilm in the gap from Thursday, September 6, 1956 to Wednesday, September 4, 1957 inclusive. However, this gap can be filled from a bound volume of original copies found at the Provincial Reference and Resource Library.


National Library of Canada

The Provincial Reference and Resource Library (P.R.R.L.) is now the designated library for holdings of all original copies of newspapers most of the holdings that were once at the Provincial Archives of Newfoundland and Labrador are generally now at P.R.R.L. (however, not yet all of these have been transferred). The following list comes from a letter by Derek Bussey of January 8, 1989[sic] (actually January 8, 1990). The holdings of microfilm are not quite correct here in Mr. Bussey's letter and are found in more detail in Table 1.

Daniel Boyce inventoried the bound volumes of originals at P.R.R.L. in full detail and that inventory follows Mr. Bussey's letter. The July 18, 1956 issue missing on the microfilm is found in the bound volume and the interval Thursday, September 6, 1956 to Wednesday, September 4, 1957 is found as one bound volume and just has never been microfilmed it seems.

Thank you for your letter of December 5, 1989. In reply to your request I am enclosing an up to date list of our holdings of the Western Star in bound, unbound and microfilm format.

With regard to the holdings of he PANL, I have been informed that they still have the bound volumes for the years 1960-69, as well as the microfilm for the period 1907-1958. Their microfilm collection has the same gaps as does our own, especially for the early years of this century.

I could not find any information regarding the holdings of the National Archives, however, according to the <u>Union List of Canadian</u> <u>Newspapers</u> the National Library has the <u>Western Star</u> on microfilm for the period 1988 to the present.

A ''smart wheelchair,'' the dietary habits of blue mussels, and newspaper earthquake stories __only a few of the subjects studied in more than 2,000 research and development contracts awarded by Supply and Services Canada so far this fiscal year.

Supply and Services has spent nearly \$159 million on R&D contracts during the first three-quarters of the current fiscal year, according to its latest R&D bulletin. The total for the same period in the previous fiscal year was \$146.2 million.

Although the total dollar value of the contracts is up nearly nine per cent over the same period in the previous year, the number of contracts awarded is down almost 17 per cent from 2,171 to 1,804. The result is a 30-per-cent increase in the value of the average contract, from \$67,353 to \$88,110.

Industry got nearly two-thirds of the contracts, while univer and i dividuals and a few government departments got the res

The biggest spender was National Defence, with \$49.1 million for 343 research projects.

Defence was followed closely by Energy, Mines and Resources, which spent \$32.3 million on 376 projects. Third was Fisheries and Oceans, which spent \$17.9 million on 362 projects.

The National Research Council just missed the top three, putting \$16.5 million into 140 projects.

Some recent projects include: a \$40,047-contract with the Hugh MacMillan Medical Centre in Toronto for a ''survey to determine (the) desired properties of a smart wheelchair,'' for the National Research Council; a \$20,000 contract the a Halifax firm to study the ''dietary selectivity of the blue tel'' for Fisheries and Oceans; and a \$4,000-deal with another thifax company to review newspaper stories on earthquakes for Energy Mines and Resources.

Perhaps one should start by asking your "staff writer", Dominique Lacasse, and your readers, a trivis question. "What earthquake was Canada's most tragic seismic event?"

On February 9, 1990 Ms. Lacasse filed a page 3 story that appeared under the headline "Strange list of R & D projects cost federal government \$159 M." The article appears to be simply a recitation of data contained in a recent edition of the Department of Supply and Services <u>R & D Bulletin</u>. It ends with a parroting of the titles of three contracts that obviously caught her eye and stuck her as "strange". I recognise that this may not have been her adjective and only the choice of an anonymous headline writer.

In the case of the "\$4000-deal with another Halifax company" - ourselves -Ms. Lacasse might have bothered to pick up the phone to find out the nature of the contract behind the title and so elucidate the Citizen's readers rather than giving them virtually no information. The National Citizens' Coalition reacts from the hip; I would hope The Ottawa Citizen would invest in at least minimal research.

Our \$4000 contract with the Geological Survey of Canada is one of a series of very modest historical seismicity studies done in the four Atlantic Provinces and Quebec over the past four years. It is important to realize that our Canadian building codes for any area are based, in part, on the record of seismic activity that the particular area has experienced. In Canada, we now record earthquakes on a quite sophisticated net of automatically recording seismographs.

Prior to 1915 (at Halifax), we had no seismograph in eastern Canada. The only record of the earlier earthquakes is to be found in the historical record such as in newspapers, diaries, etc. No truly sensitive instruments were put in Halifax until circa 1952. By the same token, the country of Newfoundiand had no seismic recording equipment until after its confederation with Canada and even then recording instrument was not installed in St. John's until June 1, 1964. Even now, the seismic recording net is quite sparce on the east coast of Canada.

Thus, our "\$4000-deal" to scan the Western Star of Cornerbrook, Newfoundland from 1900 to 1964 for evidence of felt seismic activity is part of a program to flesh out the pre-instrumental seismic history of Newfoundland. Ultimately, it will play a small role in any revised national building code for Atlantic Canada.

This is particularly relevant when you stop to consider that Canada's most tragic earthquake was the 1702 NST, November 18, 1929, magnitude 7.2 event that occurred offshore south of Newfoundland and east of Cape Breton at the edge of the continental shelf. This major event caused an underwater landshide to flow as a turbidity current (or slurry) down the continental slope, ripping up large sections of twelve submarine communications cables. It also caused a tsunami or 'tidal wave' that arrived some 2.5 hours later and caused at least 27 deaths in the Burin area of Newfoundland and one in Cape Breton Island as well as very significant shore property and vessel damage.

Clearly, the federal government has a responsibility to understand as much about the seismicity of Atlantic Canada as it can - perhaps not so "strange" had Ms. Lacasse done har job as a reporter not just as a writer?


