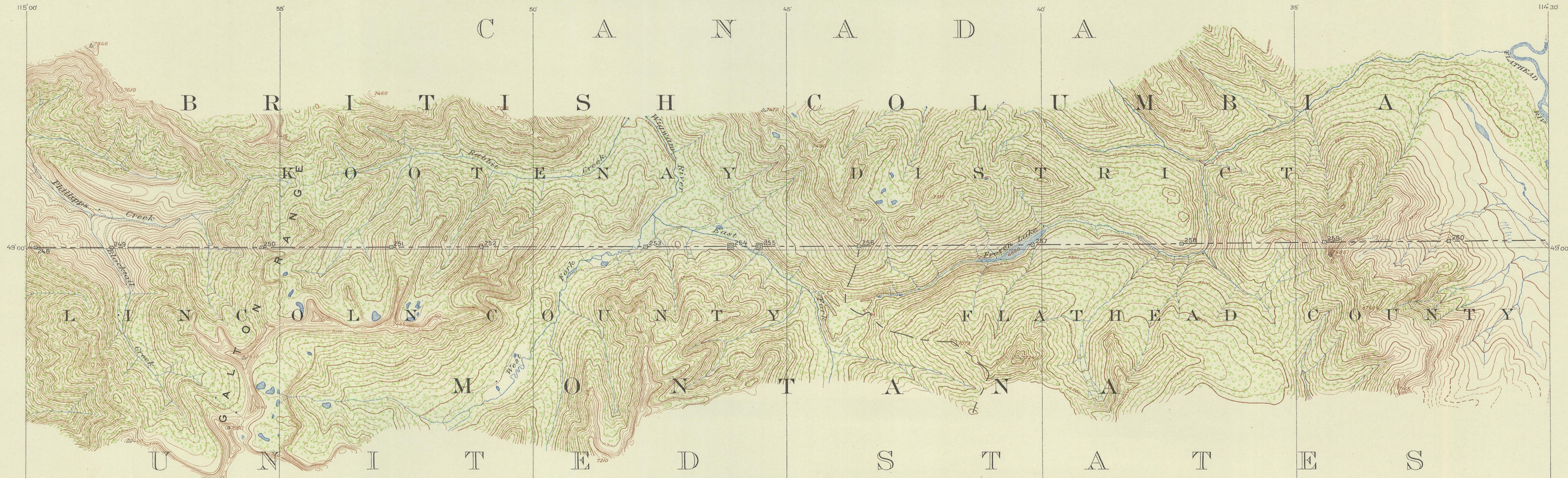




INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY

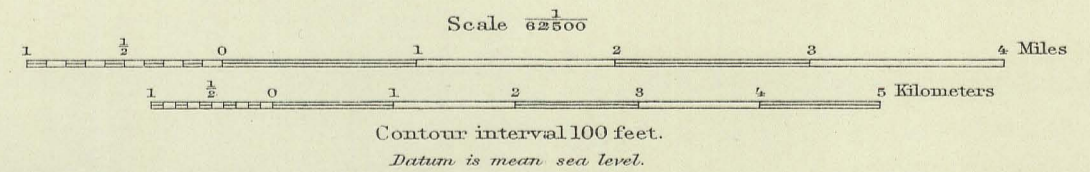
