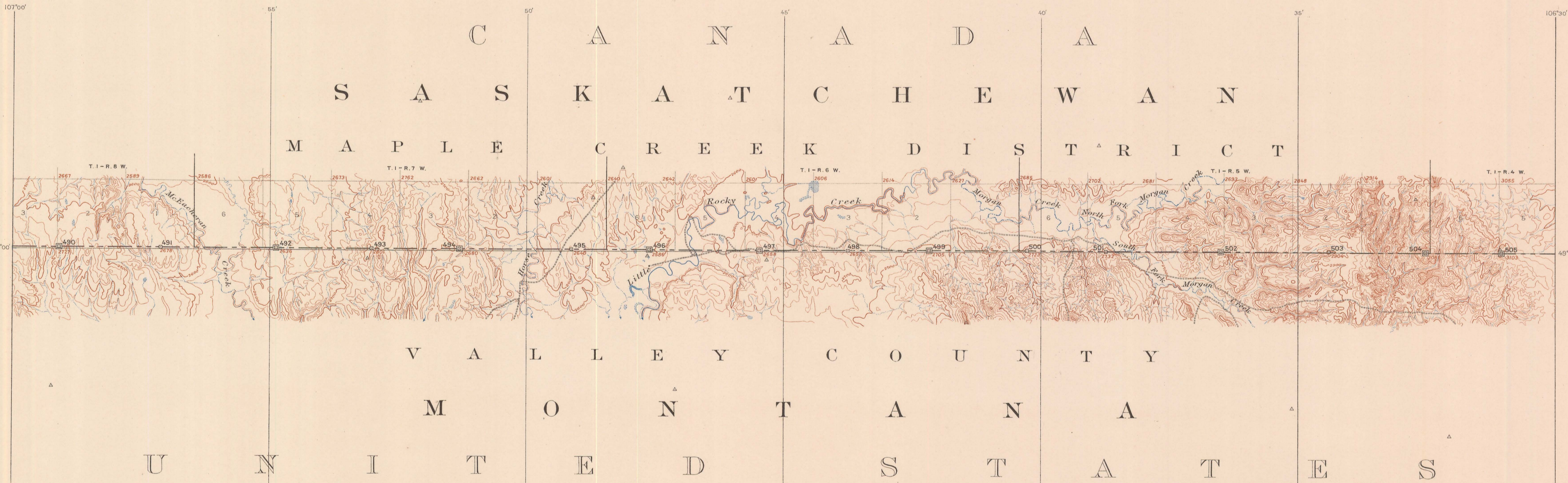


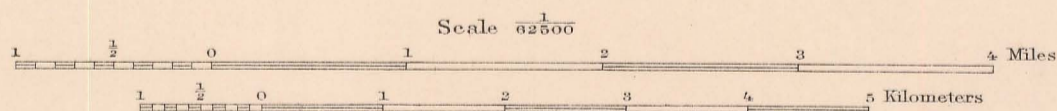


INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY
