INTRODUCTION

The Directory of Canadian Geographers was compiled originally in 1951 by Barbara Gutsell. The present edition has been revised and brought up to date by Elizabeth de Kuiper. It has been compiled, for the most part, from the results of questionnaires sent out by the Geographical Branch. These questionnaires were distributed on the basis of lists supplied by the Canadian universities in which geography is taught. In a few cases the information was obtained from other published sources and from files on hand in this office.

The directory is designed to include all geographers of Canadian citizenship who have received part or all of their training in Canada regardless of the country in which they are now employed, as well as those geographers born outside of Canada who have received part or all of their training in Canada, or who have worked or are working in Canada.

University degress listed are correct to June 1952, insofar as possible.

Present positions are stated, except in the case of students still enrolled at university and married women not at present employed. With respect to past positions, only the main ones of a geographical or related nature have been listed.

Areas known from field work and travel are also stated.

Societies are listed in the order of: Canadian societies; regional societies; foreign societies.
