**NOTE**  
 The dividing line in the area between Greenland and the Canadian Arctic islands is a line beyond which neither country has jurisdiction. The Government of the Kingdom of Denmark and the Government of Canada, in a joint declaration dated December 17, 1973, in exercising their rights under the Convention of 1956, will extend its sovereignty rights for the purpose of exploration and exploitation of the natural resources of the continental shelf.

All islands lying within Hudson Bay and Ungava Bay are part of the Northwest Territories.

A portion of the western limit of the Northwest Territories is shown as a dashed line. This line is subject to change as a result of the 1982 Constitution Act. The 1982 Constitution Act provides for the transfer of the Northwest Territories to the provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. The transfer will be completed on the date of the 1982 Constitution Act.
