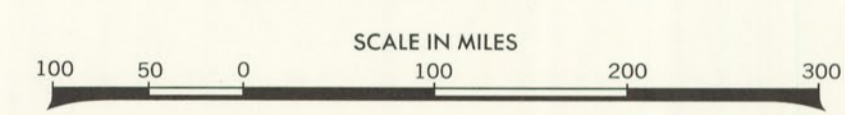


CANADA CENTENNIAL MAP NORTHWEST TERRITORIES 1870-1970



Centennial
 In 1870 title to Rupert's Land, the North-Western Territory and the Arctic Islands claimed by Britain was given by the British Government to the Dominion of Canada. A form of territorial administration was entrusted to a North-West Council, sitting in what is now Winnipeg under the general jurisdiction of the Federal Department of the Interior.
 The past 100 years have seen many changes in the political, sociological and economic development of the North. It is perhaps most fitting that our 100th Anniversary also coincides with the re-unification of the whole Northwest Territories under a new Territorial Government located in the North.
