

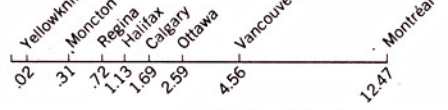
**NATIONAL LABOUR FORCE 1961**

LABOUR FORCE IN INCORPORATED AND UNINCORPORATED CENTRES OF 1000 POPULATION AND OVER

- Less than .01% of the national labour force
- .01% to .019% of the national labour force

Concentrations of .02% and more of the national labour force are indicated by proportional circles in accordance with the scale below. Black circles represent the labour force of census metropolitan areas and census urbanized areas\*; red circles apply to individual urban centres of 1000 population and over.

LABOUR FORCE DISTRIBUTED OUTSIDE INCORPORATED AND UNINCORPORATED CENTRES OF 1000 POPULATION AND OVER

- .01% of the national labour force

The value .01% of the national labour force corresponds to 651 persons. In 1961, the number of persons in the national labour force was 6,510,356.

NOTE: The national labour force as defined in the 1961 Census includes all persons 15 years of age and over who were reported as having a job of any kind, either part-time or full-time, or were reported as looking for work during the week prior to enumeration. The experienced labour force, part of the national labour force, excludes persons seeking work who have never been employed.
