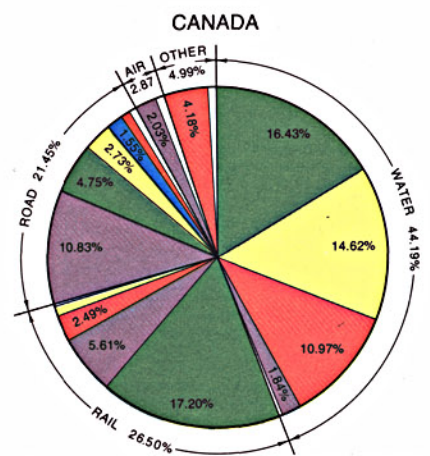
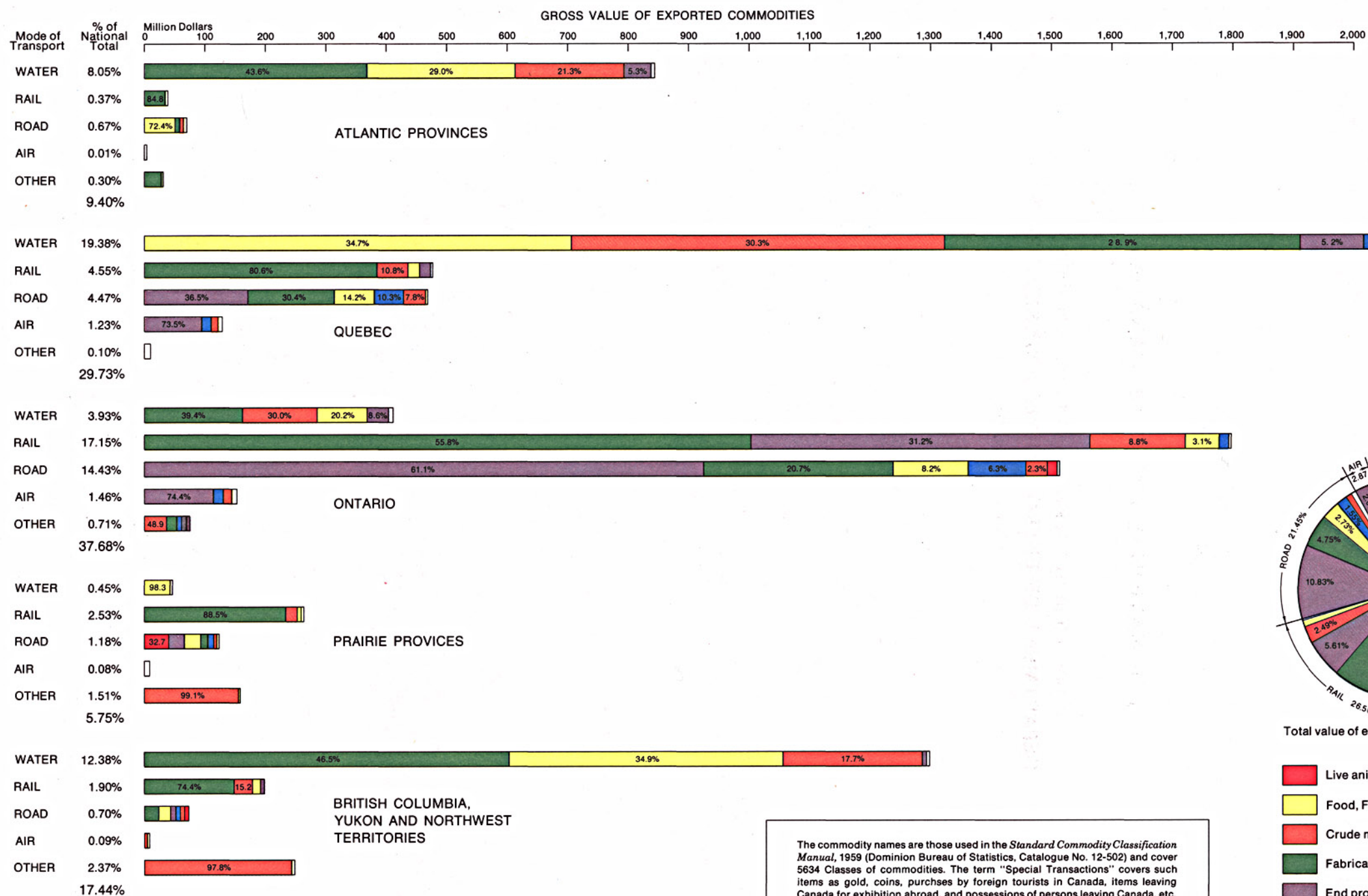


### COMMODITY EXPORTS BY MODE OF TRANSPORT, 1966

The commodity names are those used in the *Standard Commodity Classification Manual, 1959* (Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Catalogue No. 12-502) and cover 5634 Classes of commodities. The term "Special Transactions" covers such items as gold, coins, purchases by foreign tourists in Canada, items leaving Canada for exhibition abroad, and possessions of persons leaving Canada, etc.

The modes of transport designated in the graphs are those by which commodities were carried across the International Boundary. The territory from which a commodity crossed the boundary is not necessarily the territory in which it was produced. The term "Other" refers to movements by such means as pipelines, electrical transmission lines, and mail and parcel post.
