GREATEST DEPTH AT A WHARF AT LOW WATER (SPRING TIDE)*

- Greater than 40 feet
- 31 feet to 40 feet
- 21 feet to 30 feet
- No wharf

10 feet to 20 feet

- Less than 10 feet
- Dry
- Named on map

GENERALIZED ICE CONDITIONS AT NAMED PORTS

- Sarnia Closed by ice at some time during the winter
- Renews Use restricted by ice at some time during the winter
- Victoria Use not restricted by ice

*Lowest low tide which occurs shortly after the new and full moon of each month.
