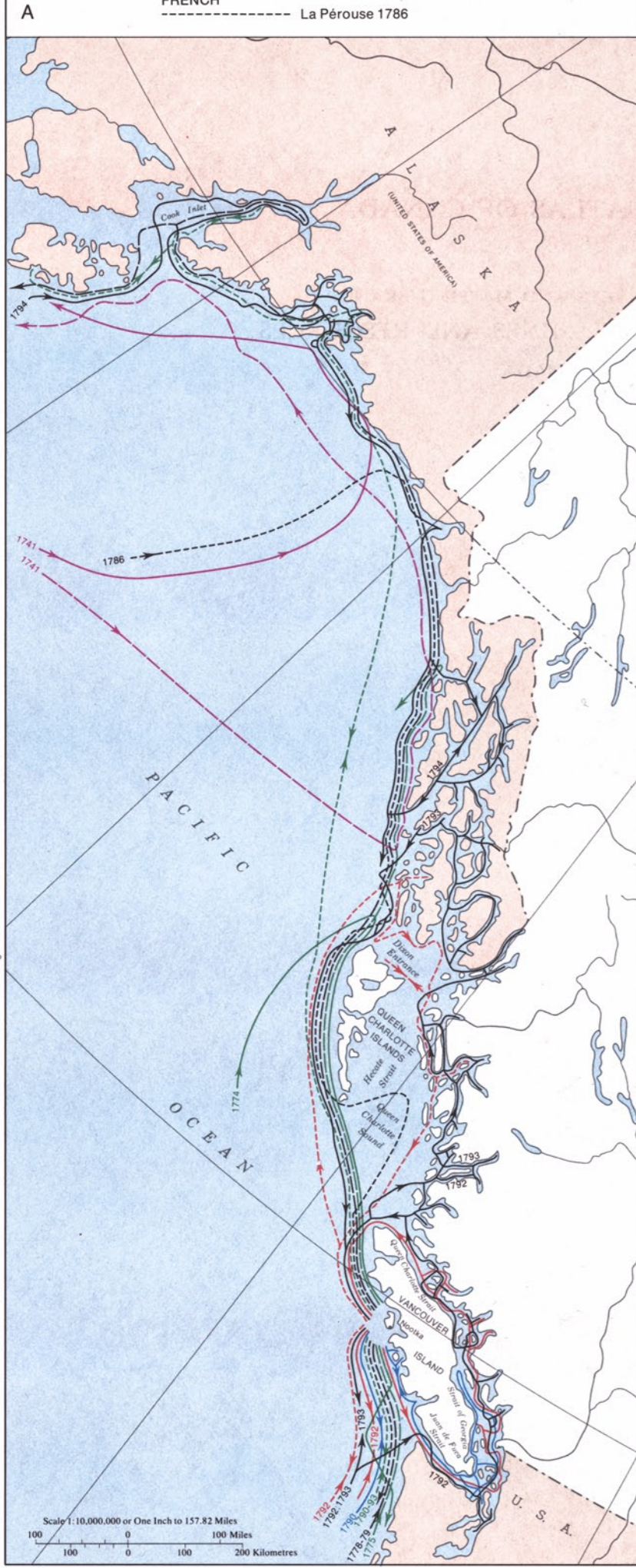

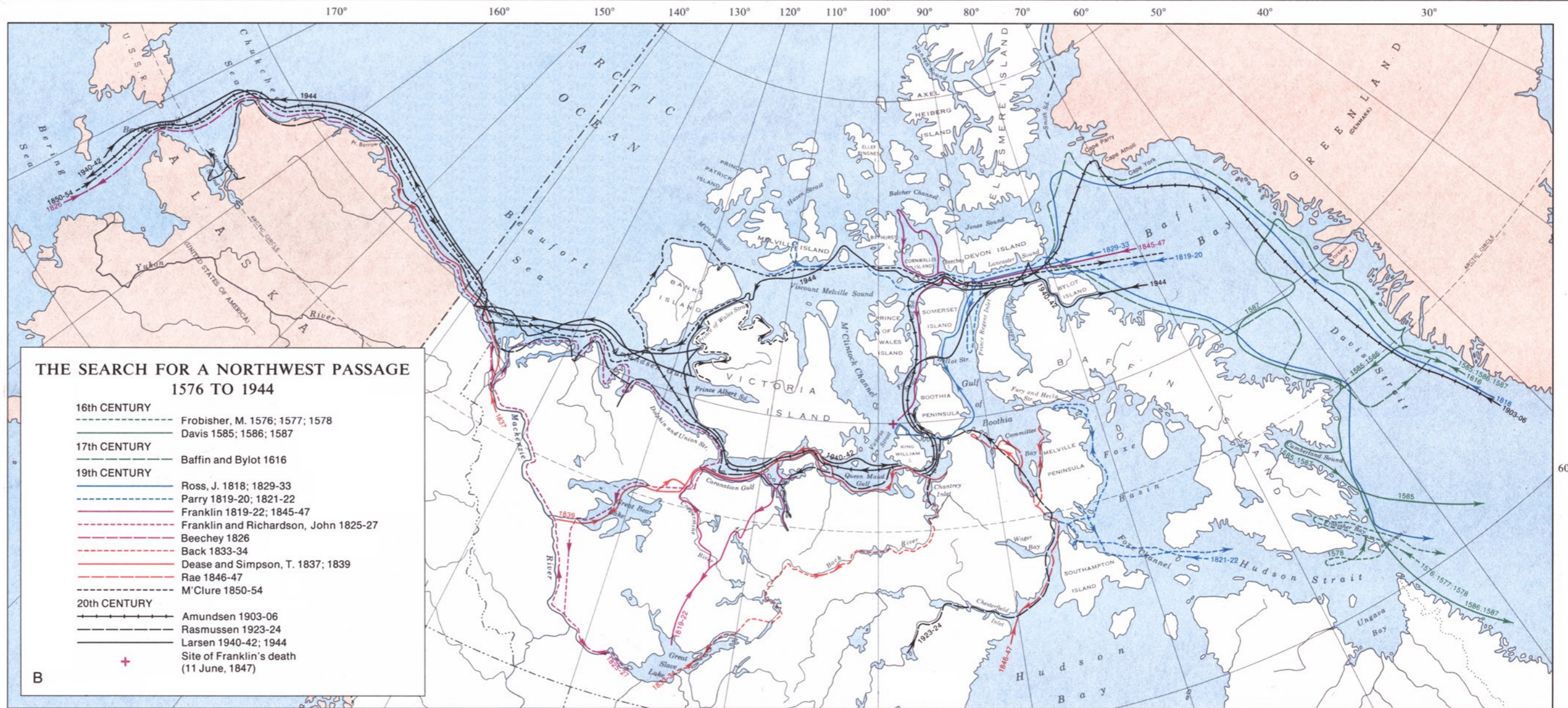

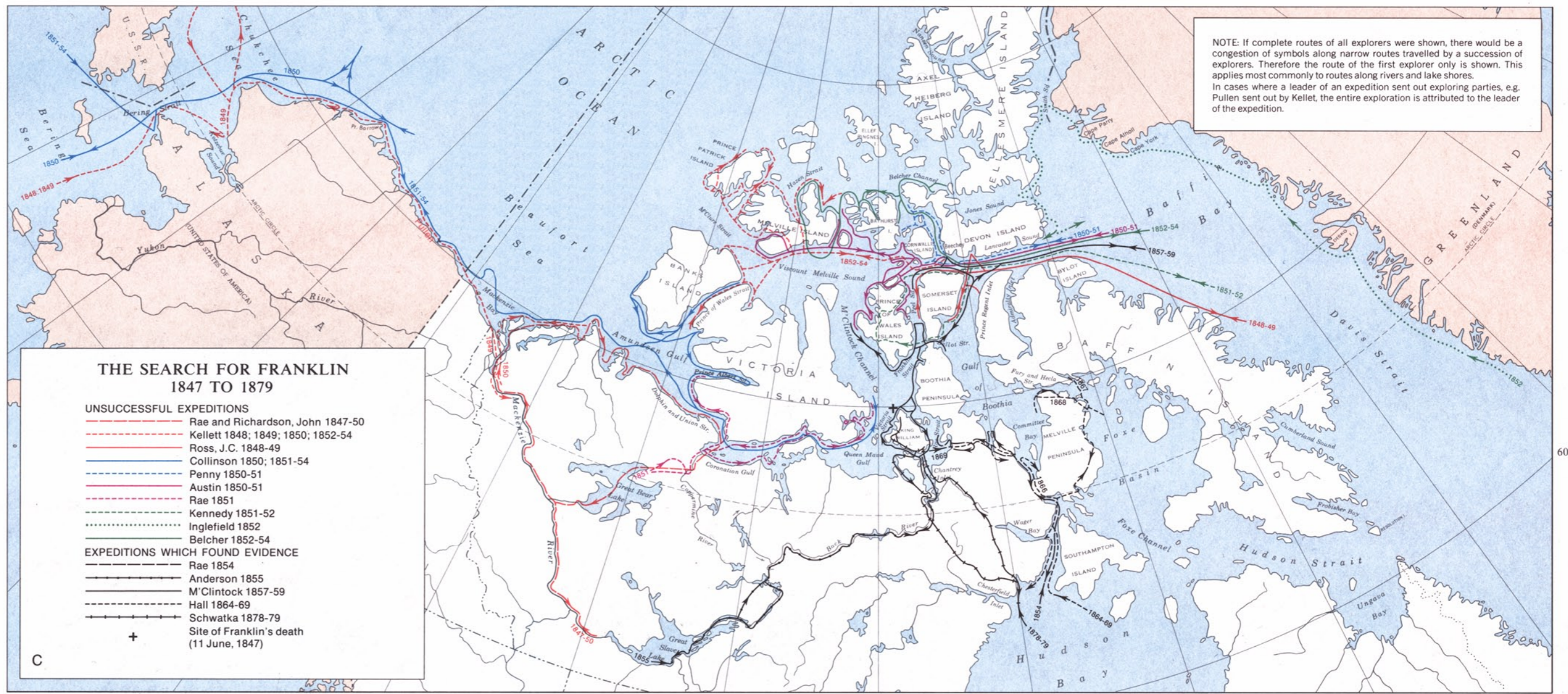

NOTE: If complete routes of all explorers were shown, there would be a congestion of symbols along narrow routes travelled by a succession of explorers. Therefore the route of the first explorer only is shown. This applies most commonly to routes along rivers and lake shores. In cases where a leader of an expedition sent out exploring parties, e.g. Pullen sent out by Kellet, the entire exploration is attributed to the leader of the expedition.
