Under subsection 118(1) of the *Fish and Wildlife Act*, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council makes the following Regulation:

2004-82

1 This Regulation may be cited as the *Wildlife Refuges and Wildlife Management Areas Regulation - Fish and Wildlife Act*.

2004-82

2 In this Regulation

“land” includes all waters of any type and includes, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, lakes, reservoirs, ponds, marshes, tidal marshes, foreshore flats, rivers, streams, brooks, inlets, coves and bays.

3 The lands described in Schedule A are designated as wildlife refuges.

4 The lands described in Schedule B are designated as wildlife management areas.

5(1) No person, except a conservation officer or assistant conservation officer, shall have in his or her possession a firearm within the boundaries of a wildlife refuge unless the firearm

6(1) No person shall at any time or in any season hunt, trap or snare any wildlife within the boundaries of a wildlife management area described in section 1, 8, 10, 11 or 12 of Schedule B.

6(2) No person shall at any time or in any season hunt any wildlife within the boundaries of a wildlife management area described in section 4, 6 or 15 of Schedule B.

6(3) No person, except a conservation officer or assistant conservation officer or any person who is authorized in writing by the Minister or the Director of Fish and Wildlife Law Enforcement, shall have in his or her possession a firearm within the boundaries of a wildlife management area described in section 1, 4, 6, 8, 10, 11, 12 or 15 of Schedule B unless the firearm, while being transported,

- (a) is in a case which is properly fastened,
- (b) is completely wrapped in a blanket or canvas which is securely tied around the firearm, or
- (c) is in the locked luggage compartment of a vehicle.

SCHEDULE A WILDLIFE REFUGES

Fredericton Wildlife Refuge

1 All that portion of The City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick described as follows:

Northeasterly by the high water mark on the north-eastern bank of the Saint John River crossing in its course the mouth of the Nashwaak River; southeasterly by a vertical plane passing through the longitudinal centre line of the Princess Margaret Bridge; southwesterly by the northeastern limit of Waterloo Row, and the prolongation thereof northwesterly, and northwesterly by a vertical plane passing through the longitudinal centre line of the bridge of the Canadian National Railways.

Kindness Club Wildlife Refuge

2 All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being at Upper Woodstock in the Parish of Woodstock, County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick and bounded and described from a survey by W. Artemus Vail, N.B.L.S. in May, 1964, as follows:

Beginning at a corner fence post at the foot of a hill on the westerly limits of Highway Route No. 2 at the southeast corner of property presently (June, 1964) occupied by Ejnar Hansen; thence along the said fence north 62° 00' west 9.17 chains to another corner fence post; thence along an old wire fence on the edge of woods south 42° 05' west 19.38 chains to another corner fence post; thence along another old wire fence south 71° 00' east 4.70 chains to the corner fence post of property presently occupied by John Elvin; thence along an old wire fence north 8° 30' east 3.00 chains to an iron rod; thence along the north side of the said John Elvin lot south 84° 45' east 1.95 chains to an iron rod;

Timber Blocks numbers 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, Ranges 3 and 4 and numbers 4, 5, 6 and 7, Range 5 and the portions of Block number 9, Ranges 3 and 4 and Blocks numbers 8 and 9, Range 5, west of the West Branch of the Musquash River containing ninety-four square miles, more or less.

MacDonald Farm Wildlife Management Area

10 All those certain lots, pieces or parcels of land and premises in the Parish of Newcastle, County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick as described in a conveyance from Rubert Brown to George Smith by deed dated November 4, 1858 and registered in the Northumberland County Registry Office on October 17, 1874 as Number 112, in Volume 56, pages 140-141, as follows:

“Being parts of Lots Numbers Sixty-nine and Seventy abutted and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a marked stone standing on the Westerly bank of Bartibog River and at the Southerly angle of that part of the said lot number Seventy owned and occupied by Ronald MacDonald, thence along the Southwesterly line of said Ronald MacDonald’s land North fifty-two degrees West seventy-two chains or until it meets the Easterly line of that part of the said Lot Sixty-nine owned and occupied by the said Ronald MacDonald, thence along the said Ronald MacDonald’s easterly side line South twenty-four degrees and thirty minutes East, sixty chains or until it meets a marked stone at the head of a small Brook in rear of the present highway, thence following down the several courses of the said







AGRICULTURAL TRAINING

Authority

1. Section 6 of the Veterans' Land Act, hereinafter referred to as the Act, makes provision for

- (a) placing veterans with selected farmers for practical instruction in farming, and
- (b) supplying instructors and inspectors to assist veterans with information on and instructions in farming.

With respect to (b), full use shall be made of existing courses, and, if such courses do not meet the needs of the Administration, suitable arrangements shall be made by District Office or Head Office with the appropriate Dominion or Provincial departments of government, the extension departments of Canadian universities and recognized agricultural schools and colleges. In effect, provision is made for pre-establishment training through training-on-the-job, and post-establishment training by means of short courses.

General Instructions

2. For the purposes of this chapter the date of establishment shall be

- (a) the date that interest commences when the veteran is settled under section 10 or 15 of the Act, or
- (b) the date of the initial disbursement when settlement is under section 30 or 39 of the Act.

3. A veteran may receive an allowance while undergoing training if his application for training is approved by the D.V.A. District Training Board. (section 8 of V.R. Act and section 10 of V.R. Regulations).

Pre-establishment Training

4. The time limit for application for pre-establishment training is the same as for other vocational training which, in general, is twelve months from date of discharge (section 8(2) of V.R. Act and section 2 of V.R. Order). Under circumstances described in section 17 of the V.R. Regulations, pensioners may apply without limitation as to date of application.

5. (1) If, at the time of application for qualification, a veteran is lacking in satisfactory farming experience, but it is apparent to the Regional Advisory Committee that his ultimate rehabilitation will be in full-time farming, he should be assisted in obtaining training-on-the-job with a suitable farmer. Normally, training allowance is unnecessary as the wage received is sufficient to meet the veteran's immediate requirements, and inadvisable as the veteran should conserve his entitlement to allowances until after establishment when it may be necessary for awaiting returns allowance or training allowance while taking short courses. However, if the wage paid by the employer-trainer is fair and reasonable, but still inadequate to meet the needs of the trainee and his dependents, the veteran should be assisted in making application for training allowance.

(2) The selection of suitable farmers under whom veterans will gain the required experience and training rests with the Regional Supervisor who shall ensure not only that the farmers are competent to provide the required training, but also that the wage is fair and reasonable, particularly if training allowance is recommended.



I acknowledge receipt of your request of the 17th instant in connection with contentious names on above-mentioned sheet, and my suggestions are as follows:

- (1) Tamarac Lake and Brook. Your suggestions regarding the correct spelling of this word as listed by Oxford and Webster as Tamarack is certainly very proper and I concur in same.
- (2) Cranberry Lake or Tomoowa Lake. I have checked our records in this connection, and while our plans seem to refer to this feature as Cranberry Lake, I also find a reference by Dr. Ganong using Tomoowa, and I concur in the suggestion that Tomoowa should be accepted.
- (3) Lake A or McCready Lake. Again our records refer to this Lake as Lake A, but I agree that McCready lake is probably a better name for this feature, and would recommend same.
- (4) Bald Head or Bald Hill. I agree that the former is preferable.
- (5) Adelaide Lake or Lake Adelaide, Ormond Lake or Lake Ormond. In the case of these two lakes, I would concur in the opinion of the Board that the generic term Lake should follow the name. There are, however, several larger lakes in the Province in settled areas, where it would be rather difficult to follow this policy.

The Board considered the names for the above map at the meeting on September 10, 1953.

With regard to the material you forwarded in 1949 it is very much regretted, that through an oversight this correspondence was not used when the basic list for the McDougall Lake map was compiled. The Board does not have the letter in question in its records.

The Board is of the opinion that the following names should be discussed and your further comments will be very much appreciated.

Tamarac Lake

Tamarac Brook

Both Oxford and Webster list "Tamarack" and the Board considers the correct spelling should be used. It is felt the form Tamarac seen on maps or in gazetteers might be regarded as an unchecked error by a great many people.

Cranberry Lake

or

Tomooowa Lake

The name Tomooowa Lake is a Board decision and is an unusual name. Your suggestion Cranberry Lake is not considered an improvement considering how often it is duplicated. The Board is reluctant to change the name Tomooowa.

Lake A

or

McCready Lake

The Board does not favour initials for a name. McCready Lake is a form decision. The files indicate that McCready was suggested by the Member of the Board for New Brunswick in 1938. McCready was a nearby land owner and there is a notation that the Crown Land plan shows two spellings (McCredie and McCready). It was pointed out that the spelling accepted locally at that time was McCready.

Bald Head

or

Bald Hill

Because the name Bald Hill is frequently duplicated the Board was of the opinion that Bald Head already shown on New Brunswick map 27-A (1922) is preferable.

Adelaide Lake

or

Lake Adelaide


The comments on this map by Mr. Pugh as listed in your memorandum of Aug. 5 have been noted.
