DEAR SIR,

I wish to obtain information respecting the derivation of the place-names of Canada-of the names of the villages, towns, cities and of the natural features, such as rivers, lakes, capes, bays, mountains, etc.-and shall be much obliged if you will give me any information that you may possess or can procure, respecting the below-mentioned name and also respecting the names of any other features in the vicinity of your residence concerning which you have knowledge.

In many localties, the older generation is passing, or has passed away, and unless steps are taken to collect this information, it will, in many instances, be too late. In most communities there are persons who take an interest in things of this nature or that have been connected with the early settlement of the locality. If there are any such in your neighbourhood, will you kindly submit this to them.

Below I have indicated the lines along which I desire information and also the commoner derivatives of place-names in Canada :--

(1.) Whether named after a village, town, or city, or natural feature in any other province or country; if so, the name of province or country in which the original locality is situated.

(2.) Whether named after a person; if so, the person's name, occupation, spelling of name as rendered by the person and any details of interest respecting him (or her) such as (a) Whether alive or, if dead, approximate year of death; (b) Whether at any time a resident of the locality and, if so, whether still living there.

(3.) Whether named after a natural feature ; if so, any details respecting the origin of the name as applied to the feature and the geographical position of the latter.

(4.) Whether the town, village or city ever had any other name or names; if so, at what dates, approximately, and the origin of these obsolete names.

Any information bearing on the above will be deemed a courtesy.

Bealton . is situated on a small com called Boston creek in the third and fourth concessions where they are crossed by the cast quester town line of Townsand township. In the Pioneen days of the country, settlemente were made at Boston and Hortford mostly by New Englanders, and midway between the two a third was formed and named from its central position Centreville, by its first settles who came about about The year 1857 an agitation was make by a number of younger residents to change the mame of the seltenery, and a weeting was called in the School house for that purpose. This gathering elected to change the name to Sabula" at the suggestion of one Darling Smith," and a flag was prepared with this new mame upon it. But Centerville was too firmly rooted as a name and the settlement was known by that name until the organizen of a lost office about 1870. When the name Bealton was selected so named in an complement to the Beal family who were among the pioneers settlers, since then

The first school was evented in 184 on the south east comer of the hamlet, since then a brick building replaced the original frame one's about 1856, and again this was replaced by the present Brick structure built in 1882. The first School teacher was him many Hayes. The first church building to be erected was build by The wesleyen methodest, it was a frame structure erected on the form of Peter Beal on the west side of the east quoter toten line near the south webt wellage comer. built about the year 1851. a saw mill was built just north of the village on the creed by Mrs Brazilla Beal in 1841. John Boyber operated a small tonnery about a mile west of the corners as early as 1832 Mr I rank Julmer was appointed the first Post moster of Bealton, the office site then was somewhat east of the present location. My Veter Beal and Bragilla Beal of the original family died about a quarter of a century ago on the forms which they cleared and cultivated. any furthin forticulors gladby fiven yours July Percy Jumer PM
