

Billingsbridge

A small village in the Township of Gloucester about half a mile from the limits of Ottawa City the Capital of the Dominion of Canada. It contains four churches, a Township Hall, a Public School, a Post office, a Blacksmith Shop, three stores or carriage shop and a number of private residences. It derives its name from Bradish Billings, a prominent individual who purchased a large quantity of land and settled there in the year 1812. Six years before another man settled in that Township - he was born in the State of Massachusetts in the year ~~1774~~ 1784 and died at his home in the Township of Gloucester in 1864 - was a descendant of Puritan ancestors who settled in the New England States as early as 1630. He was instrumental in building the first bridge over the ^{River} Rideau where he resided and in the year 1831 which was called Billingsbridge - hence the name of the present village Billingsbridge.
