Kilbride was named after a town in Ireland by a pioneer settler, named William Pantou who died at Milton in 1865. Kilbride so far as I can ascertain was never known by any other name. Gummsville about half a mile from Kilbride was named after John Gumms, the principal settler there.

A branch of the Twelve mile Creek which flows into Lake Ontario at Bronte was named by Mrs. Pantou the British which means so far as I know the fish place.
