Dear Sir,

In reply to yours of Nov. 7th I may say that - Rose Hall, was a name given to the P.O. and small hamlet by Peter Vermilyea a prominent - farmer living in the place but deceased since 1874. There is nothing he named it for, or from, that - I am aware of. Since the P.O. was established it has gone by that name. Before that time it bore the name of my Grand father, Dr. Thos. Reynold who built a just a saw mills on the creek which was dammed and quite a large pond became the head for water supply. The drainage from swamps and some large springs furnish the water. The hamlet went by the name of Reynold's Creek up to the time a P.O. was located there. Rose Hall Ont.

About 3 1/2 or 4 miles from Rose Hall is a picturesque point and Bay. Also the lake forms a cove there with fine sand beach and a few small sand banks.

The oldest name I know it by is Suked-Huyck's Point or Huyck's point - named after a Huyck family which used to live there.

It now goes by the name of Higgins' Point. after a Higgins family who live there now. It went by the name of Delong's Point after a Delong family for a time.

There is a deep indentation in the rock at the point known as the Devil's Glen.

Nicholsan's or Emmanis Island lies out a mile or so from the point and the Scotch Bonnet lighthouse beyond it.

Any other information you may require let me know. You doubtless know the Sand Banks about 5 or 6 miles from

Wellington. ^{The Bay I referred to above has always been known as Huyck's Bay.}
