Dear Sir

As I was busy engaged the
time your letter reached here which caused my neglect
in answering it until now.

Wayside is the name of our post office and there
is no village or town in connection with it. It is just
a thickly settled country and within three miles from the
town of Perth. The office was named after the farm
our farm was named "Wayside Farm", which some people
thought proper for the Post office. It is very close to the main
road. So close the mail driver drives along and picks the
mail bag from a post at the door without stopping his horse.
The road forms a V with the two roads here. One road is from
Carlton and other one from Inverurie and they both meet
here and follow in one road to Perth. There is no river
or water stream near than Perth Tay river. The place
never had any other name except "Dykes Corners" as it
is yet sometimes called after the family living here.
It is very convenient to a school also. The office does
a good mailing business and gets a bulk of mail owing
to it being so very convenient to passers by.
Hoping this information will be satisfactory to you
