Sir:- I duly received your Circular letter of the 2th September, and in

reply thereto I beg to advise you a Follows:-

The name of Wiarton, as well asothe names of the surrounding Municipalis are taken from the names of Localities connected and having associations with the family of the Earl of Albermarle. These names were given by the surveyors, who I presume were from those localities in England. I believe Wiarton is taken from the name of a small place in the Isle of Wight. I have not a book of reference to which I could refer you, butt no doubt you will have the opportunity at Ottawa, which we have not here, inthat respect.

It is rather interesting to notice the occurrence in this neighborhood of names connected with the Albermarle family. The names of the Townships are Kepph Amabel, Albermarle, Eastnor, Lindsay & St. Edmund, and the Town Plots Whish were laid out by the surveyors, were named Wiarton, Oliphant, Hardwicke, Adair,

Bury St. Edmund.

I have been told that the Wiarton in the Isle of Wight, is connected with Estate of Lady Somerset, the Temperance And social Refemer in England., who is related to the Albermarle family. You will probably gain some information in that tespect by tonsulting the proper authorities.

I regret to say that I cannot give you more positive information, but I think

you will be able to find what you want.
